GIFT AID DECLARATION - MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR GIFT

Robinson College may reclaim the basic rate tax on all gifts, provided that you have paid an amount of UK Income Tax or Capital Gains Tax equal to the tax we reclaim. This means that every £10 donated is worth £12.80 (or £12.50 after April 5th 2008), and the difference is paid by the Inland Revenue, at no cost to you. If you pay tax at the higher rate, then you may claim further tax relief on your self-assessment Tax Return.

I wish Robinson College to treat this donation and all donations I make from the date of this declaration, until I notify you otherwise, as Gift Aid donations.

NOTES ON GIFT AID

This slip should be detached and retained by the payee

1. If your declaration covers donations you make in the future:

- please notify the charity if you change your name or address while the declaration is still in force
- you can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying the charity – it will then not apply to donations you make on or after the date of cancellation, or such later date as you specify.

2. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donation in the tax year.

3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the charity reclaims, you can cancel your declaration (see note 1).

4. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self Assessment tax return.

5. If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid tax relief, ask the charity. Or you can ask your local tax officer for leaflet IR113 Gift Aid.

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
